#### Some friendly reminders:

\*Please remember that all tamariki **must wear a hat for outside play**. If your child does not have a hat at the centre please bring one along for your child to wear. If your child does not have a hat they will be required to play indoors. Please ensure that your child's hat is clearly named. Hats can be left at the centre for everyday use.

Please remember that all children must have **sunscreen applied before arriving at the centre**. If you have forgotten to apply on arrival please use the sunscreen at reception. Please use the stamp provided to stamp your child's hand when they have had sunscreen applied, either at home or on arrival. This helps us to know that all children are protected from the sun before they begin their outside play. Your child will have sunscreen reapplied after lunch each day.

With warm days please remember to pack a **variety of suitable clothes** for your child's day. The weather can still be quite unpredictable so please pack clothes suitable for all occasions. It is a great idea to pack in your child's togs or rash vest for your child to wear during water play activities. Please also remember to pack a wet bag so that wet clothes can go home inside these.

- \*Bugs are unfortunately still circulating around the centre. **Please keep your child at home if they are unwell.** It is important to keep your child at home if they are not feeling 100%. Please refer to our traffic light system "is your child well enough to play today" to guide you as to whether your child is well enough to attend the centre. This can be found displayed in rooms within the
- \*Please remember to **sign your child's attendance** each week on the desk at reception. Please do not let your children draw on this as it is a document requirement from the Ministry of Education.
- \*Please remember to sign your child out if you are taking your child to an appointment. Please sign your child out when you leave the centre and on return sign your child back in on the tablets. This helps us to know who is and who isn't in the centre in case of an emergency situation.
- \*Our black **pool fence gates now have self closing hinges**. This means they self shut once they are open. We ask that you do not let children help you open the gates or let children swing on them.
- \*Please remember at **drop off and pick up times siblings of children are the responsibility of the parent/caregiver**. Please make sure that they are being supervised while you are in the centre.
- \*Please remember the **speed limit in our driveway to The Learning Barn is 30ks per hour.** Please keep to this speed for the safety of others.
- \*Please do not leave your vehicle's running in the car park when dropping off or picking up your child. For the safety of others please turn your vehicle off before you enter the centre.

#### **Are you entitled to a Childcare Subsidy?**

From 1st April 2023, income thresholds for the Childcare Subsidy and Out of School Care and Recreation (OSCAR) Subsidy's increased. This means more people are able to get these payments.
